EXPORT CONTROL ACT 2020

If your project involves exporting live animals or plants, animal or plant products, or food, you must comply with this Act.

1. What approvals do I need?

Permits and export certificates are required for the export of most goods including:

- Live animals, including companion animals and animal reproductive material
- Egg and egg products
- Fish and fish products
- Dairy products
- Meat and meat products
- Organic and biodynamic goods
- Plants and plant products
- · Poultry meat and products
- Rabbit and ratite meat and products
- Wild game meat and products
- Wood and woodchips.

Premises where most goods are prepared for export must be registered or accredited, including:

- Abattoirs
- EU cattle accredited and horticulture accredited properties
- Pre-export quarantine, treatment and testing of live plants and livestock
- Treatment, processing, packing or storage facilities
- Fishing vessels where product is prepared for export.

Exporters of beef, sheep and goat meat, and livestock are required to be licensed

2. Who provides approvals?

The Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment regulates the export of goods under the *Export Control Act 2020.*

3. How do I get Australian Government approval?

- registration of an establishment here
- registration of an establishment for livestock exports here
- meat export licence here
- livestock export licence here
- permits and export certificates for non-livestock commodities <u>here</u>.
